For several months now we have been talking about and planning for the arrival of "The Curate," a newly ordained clergy person who will be coming on staff here this summer. Well, Grace Church, blessings abound! After months of conversation and discernment and with full vestry and diocesan support, Jodi and Christian Baron, will be coming to Grace together to be "The Curates" – plural. Each will have a distinct job description but they will share this full-time position while also settling themselves and their three daughters into lives of ministry in Western Michigan.

Both Christian and Jodi will experience the full range of parish ministry from preaching and presiding to participating in pastoral care, outreach, and commission work. Each will also have particular focus areas. Jodi will focus on Formation (Children and Young Families) and Hispanic Ministries. From the Property Task Force

We need your thoughts, your prayers, and your input!

Grace has taken amazing steps over the past few years in terms of growth in ministries, community, outreach, and improvements to our church and properties. We are in a growing yet stable place as a congregation and have the responsibility to consider the needs and possibilities of the Grace that is yet to be. To this purpose, a property task force has been formed that will look at "Grace-Lands." And we need your input as we look ahead, always striving to be faithful, good stewards of God's many gifts to us.

Grace owns a wonderful church building, three houses and a side yard (which is two neighborhood lots.) The properties marked with an asterisk on the diagram on the next page indicate those that are owned by Grace Church.

Building on the work done in 2012 by a houses team, we've moved into a short-term plan that includes welcoming a curate family into the Parish House this summer and keeping the other houses in the Community Housing Partnership. Still in consideration is the possibility of using one of the houses for the young adult program of The Episcopal Service Corp. The two empty lots are undeveloped.

Right now our task is to dream a bit, open long and short-term doors, and ask important questions. Should we use the empty lots differently than we do? Are there needs in this community going unmet that our buildings and land could help meet? Do we need more space in our church building? Let us know what you think!



HAVE YOU EVER THOUGHT OF JOINING GRACE'S CHOIR?


