From June 9th -18th a group of twelve youth and adults from Grace will once again be traveling "The Pilgrims' Way" in England. We'll be walking about fifty miles from Rochester to Canterbury, visiting towns along the way and sleeping on the floors of host churches. The journey will include Church history, evening Eucharists, Bible Study, "Questions of the Day," Evensongs, conversations, silence, and the simple experience of being together "walking the mile and sharing the load."

Pilgrimage is one of the most incredible pieces of our youth program at Grace. 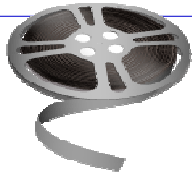
EfM aka Education for Ministry

Every baptized person is called to ministry. The Education for Ministry (EfM) program provides people with the education to carry out that ministry. During the Service of Confirmation we ask God to "Renew in these your servants the covenant you made with them at Baptism. Send them forth in the power of the Spirit to perform the service you set before them." EfM offers an opportunity to discover how to respond to the call to Christian service.

EfM is truly, an intensive program of life-long learning! It comprises four years; a year of Old Testament, a year of New Testament, a year of Church History and a final year that takes a look at contemporary theologies and theologians.

EfM meets from September – May, meeting each Tuesday evening from 6:30 – 9:00 pm. We begin our time in worship, transitioning to discussing our lesson of the week, take a break for refreshment and usually spend our last time segment together in a time of Theological Reflection – looking at a slice of life and basically asking 'What (happened), So What and finally, Now What – how am I to respond to this particular slice of life! We do this using a variety of models of Theological Reflection – looking reflectively at our lives in light of scripture, tradition and culture.

Wednesday Night, June 6, Crash

Theme: Race Relations

Movie studios, by and large, avoid controversial subjects like “race” the way you might avoid a hive of angry bees. So it's remarkable that Crash even got made; that it's a rich, intelligent, and moving exploration of the interlocking lives of a dozen Los Angeles residents--black, white, latino, Asian, and Persian--is downright amazing. A politically nervous district attorney (Brendan Fraser) and his high-strung wife (Sandra Bullock, biting into a welcome change of pace from Miss Congeniality) get car-jacked by an oddly sociological pair of young black men (Larenz Tate and Chris "Ludacris" Bridges); a rich black T.V. director (Terrence Howard) and his wife (Thandie Newton) get pulled over by a white racist cop (Matt Dillon) and his reluctant partner (Ryan Phillippe); a detective (Don Cheadle) and his Latina partner and lover (Jennifer Esposito) investigate a white cop who shot a black cop--these are only three of the interlocking stories that reach up and down class lines. Writer/director Paul Haggis (who wrote the screenplay for Million Dollar Baby) spins every character in unpredictable directions, refusing to let anyone sink into a stereotype. The cast--ranging from the famous names above to lesser-known but just as capable actors like Michael Pena (Buffalo Soldiers) and Loretta Devine (Woman Thou Art Loosed)--meets the strong script head-on, delivering galvanizing performances in short vignettes, brief glimpses that build with gut-wrenching force. This sort of multi-character mosaic is hard to pull off; Crash rivals such classics as Nashville and Short Cuts. A knockout. --*Bret Fetzer*

FEEDING AMERICA

Mark your calendars for our upcoming Feeding America dates: **June 14th, July 12th and August 9th**. We need folks to arrive between 4:30 and 5:00 to help with set-up and to welcome our guests. Also, remember the ongoing need for *laundry detergent (see special request) and toilet paper!* You can bring these items at any time and deposit them in the labeled drawers in the Commons. With a little corporate help we have managed to regularly distribute these items to each family. Good job Grace!



Special request: We appreciate the many laundry detergent donations we receive, but if possible, please keep the bottles under 70oz. for ease in distribution.

For the past 28 months Grace Church has served 2,774 families with our Feeding America Outreach initiative. Once a month, Grace has distributed 5,000 pounds of food together with toilet paper and laundry soap. This totals 140,000 pounds of food and approximately 2,600 bottles of soap and 11,096 rolls of toilet paper!

The cost for food is covered through our Outreach budget. However, we are dependent on our member's in kind contributions of soap and toilet paper. Because the number of families served has risen significantly, we also encourage financial contributions to help us meet the need. These may be made by check to Grace Church noting in the memo section "FA soap & paper."

The families we serve through Feeding America are very appreciative as Grace continues to reach out in our community.

Kentucky Missions

Teachers for reading instruction are needed to work with 2nd, 3rd, and 4th graders in Lexington, Kentucky, June 22 to 29. Teacher Aides are needed to help in instruction and crafts. Youth Counselors ranging in ages 16 to 22 are needed to assist teachers and aides with the crafts, recreation, including swimming, and overnight in student housing.

Swimming instructor certification is a plus for Youth Counselors.

Volunteers return to Kentucky the second and third week of September to rehab houses in one of the most impoverished areas of our country located within the Episcopal Diocese of Lexington.

South Dakota Mission

August 10 to 17 is the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation Mission. Volunteers will immerse themselves in the Lakota Indian culture. Participants will travel through the Bad Lands visiting many historical sites, such as Wounded Knee. Working with tribal leaders, basic home repair will also be part of this mission. Volunteers can help with painting, insulation, building bunk beds, dry wall, or flooring.

New Orleans Mission

This will be the fourth year for this popular mission. Home repair continues to be the number one priority. This mission also offers community projects for those desiring an alternative to rehabbing homes. Volunteers can landscape refurbished homes, or plant trees or shrubs in the greater New Orleans area.

For all three missions, the Diocese covers the cost of registration, gas directly to and from the mission by car pools, motels up to \$80 per night directly to and from a mission, plus housing and meals while at the mission.

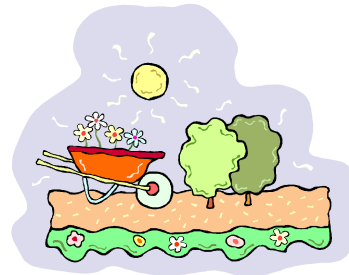

Stewardship / Taking Grace Green

Recycle.

Summer is a good time to take another look at how we Recycle the things we can't Repair or find a way for someone to Reuse. The number of places that take our used up things for recycling is growing. Here are some of the best known places:

BPW, Menards, and Lowes take compact fluorescent light bulbs, and **Lowes** takes NiCad and Lithium batteries.

Family Fare and the **Holland mission** takes plastic bags.

Repolite takes still usable latex paint and the cans it comes in . . . and you get a credit voucher.

Goodwill takes used and broken electronics which are then stripped and the components recycled.

Black River Recycling takes all kinds of metals, old gas grills, appliances, and other items, and they will pay you for the material if you choose. **Chef Container**, who does Holland's recycling curb pickup, will take old refrigerators, electronics, and appliances with a voucher from the City of Holland.

Habitat for Humanity takes used building materials of all kinds.

The Outpost, downtown, takes used poly fiber content Patagonia garments as part of the Patagonia Common Threads initiative and will ship them to Patagonia for recycling or resale.

Staples takes used computer toner and ink jet cartridges.

Ottawa County Resources Recovery Center, 14053 Quincy, (616 494-5569 or 616 335-1335), takes oil based paints, hazardous liquids, and other hard to get rid of materials.

And

The Tree Hugger, on 8th Street in downtown Holland, (<http://thetreehuggerstore.com/recycling.html>) takes almost everything. (See their website or the list on the next page)

Recycling has become part of everyday living for most of us. Product manufacturers and marketers are recycling materials into their product content, food growers and marketers are using recycled materials in their packaging, garment manufacturers and marketers are using recycled fibers in their products, building material producers are using recycled material in their products.
